And with the MTV Video Music Awards coming soon, we're looking at the places where these well-known videos, old and new, were created. 1 in 9 Taylor Swift, Blank Space - Oheka Castle is a 100,000-square-foot home in Huntington, New York, on the north shore of Long Island. It was built in the early 1900s as a vacation home for investment financier and philanthropist Otto Hermann Kahn. Today, the estate is a 32-room hotel and popular wedding venue for celebrities. Several music videos, shows and films have shot in the regal position. In particular, Taylor Swift's Blank Space took place within the castle walls, and is now nominated for best female video and best pop video at the VMAs. 2 of 9 Not only does the house in this video look super relaxing and glamorous, it's also for sale. You can float like Ed Sheeran for just \$15 million, which, compared to the original asking price of \$26 million, isn't bad for 9,500 square feet of marble and gold décor. Don't is nominated for two VMAs, including Best Choreography. 3 of 9 Here's another music video house you can buy now, and this is a theft at \$8.7 million. Britney Spears shot her video Work B4ch in this white and contemporary building accented by huge stained glass windows. The house is barely recognizable in the dimly lit video, but if you turn up the melody and dim the lights at night, you might be able to channel your inner English. Although Work B4ch was not nominated for any VMA last year, some vehemently claim that he was snubbed. 4 of 9 Nick Jonas, Chains - Hotel Alexandria Hotel Alexandria was built in the early 1900s as a luxury hotel in then-downtown Los Angeles. As the business district moved westward, the hotel decayed and eventually became low-income housing. Its historic ballroom has been preserved, however, and is a popular filming venue due to the lack of occupants. Chains, who shot inside the hotel, is nominated for best male video. 5 of 9 This Miami home has been described as the last fun property and is currently on the market for \$20 million. The Best Song Ever music video doesn't explore much of the house, so the boy band missed the opportunity to mount their stuff on a private rooftop deck with an infinity pool and waterfall, among other things. The Kardashians are among other celebrities who have visited this Miami mansion (they shot their Christmas card in 2012). Best Song Ever won the award for Best Song of the Summer at the 2013 VMAs. 6 of 9 Spice Girls, Wannabe - The Midland Grand Hotel This five-star luxury hotel in St. Pancras, London, was home to the hit video Wannabe, shot in 1996. now now as the St. Pancras Renaissance London Hotel, the original building opened in 1873 and went through several renovations. Despite some concerns that it would not be well received in the United States, Wannabe won best dance video at the 1997 VMA. 7 of 9 This incredibly secluded home outside Los Angeles was designed by the same architect in charge of the Kennedy Center and Pepperdine University. Located on top of a hill, it has 360-degree views of the adjacent nature reserve. Other productions have shot at this house including Dream Girls and Mad Men, but Usher's hit video is probably the most recognizable. Burn was nominated in 2004 for Best R&B Video at the VMAs. 8 of 9 The Singer of Florence - The Machine chose her home to be the background to the video Ship to Wreck. The colorful, period-filled south London home took a darker turn for its starring role, but Welch let Vogue look around the modest pad two years ago when she bought it, so proof of its cheerful décor exists. Ship to Wreck is nominated for Best Rock Video. 9 of 9 Like Welch, Beyoncé shot this 2008 video in one of her homes. The five-story SoHo residence is barely there, as most of the video shows close-up shots of Beyoncé and actor Michael Ealy. A few years after Halo's first, the house was available to rent for \$100,000 a month - a small price to pay to lay where Queen Bey slept. Although Halo was not nominated for any VMAs, Beyoncé was nominated in nine categories for Single Ladies in the same year. Not only can adding a music track bring a scene to life, but it can also help you connect with your Instagram followers by sharing with them the kind of songs you like. While using music for Instagram videos and other posts used to be officially misrevised, it is now strongly encouraged by users and developers. Here are the three best ways to add music to an Instagram post. This feature is available on personal accounts. The easiest way to add music to your Instagram Story is to use the special Music sticker, which is available in the latest versions of the official Instagram app on iOS and Android devices. Open the Instagram app and tap the Your Story icon in the upper left corner to create a new Tap the circle icon to take a photo or record a video as usual. Tap the Stickers icon on the top menu. It's what looks like a known post-it smiley face. Tap Music. Instagram Stories using the Music sticker will be shared on linked Facebook accounts, but due to copyright restrictions, the music will not be You can upload your Instagram Story video as a Facebook story with the music intact, saving it to your device after it's live and manually uploading it to Facebook from the Facebook app. Search for the music track you want to use in your Instagram Story. You can tap the circle playback icons to preview the songs before adding them. Once you find the song you're looking for, tap the album cover to add it to your story. Tap 15 and choose the track length for your story. Track length is limited due to copyright restrictions. Instagram Stories are typically less than 15 seconds anyway, so this limitation shouldn't be a problem for many. Tap Finish. Drag the white bar to select the part of the song that you want to use. Tap Finish. Tap the Music sticker to choose a different style. Pinch the adhesive with two fingers to resize and move it. Add more stickers, gifs, and text as usual. Tap Send To to post the new story to your Instagram account. Select Share next to your story. This third method of adding music to Instagram Stories is how everyone was used to adding songs to videos before the music sticker feature launched. This can also be used when shooting regular video posts. Since this method adds music in an unofficial capacity, Instagram automatically scans it for any copyright infringement. If detected, Instagram will simply remove all sound from the entire video. Your account will not be closed and there are no legal consequences. While it is an old method, it is still effective and can be used to embed music songs that are not officially available within the Instagram app. This also removes the time limit for each song. Open your favorite music app on your device and start playing a song. For this example, we will use Spotify. Minimize the app with the song still playing in the background and open Instagram. Tap your avatar or small camera icon in the upper left corner to start a new Instagram Story. Press the recording button for a long time to record a video. The song you are playing and all the other audio will be recorded along with the video. Keep editing your story as usual, adding filters, text, and gifs. When you're ready, tap Send To to publish it. Select Share next to your story. While Instagram allows you to crop a video and add filters during the upload process to your main Instagram feed, it offers no way to add music to it. This means that you will have to add music to your video using another app, save it, then upload this newly edited video to Fortunately, there are a large number of free video editing applications available for iOS, Android and Windows which makes adding music to video clips very easy. If you use the first two methods to add music to your Instagram Story with the Music sticker, you don't have to worry about finding music since the sticker essentially provides you with the entire Spotify song library. however if you use the third method or you want to add to an Instagram video post, you'll need to find a track to use on your own. Technically, you can use any Spotify song, iTunes or any other music service, but your video may be marked for copyright infringement. The safest option is to use royalty-free music from one of the many websites available online. They provide free and paid options for using music and are typically open to anyone. Another option is to compose your own music using a music creation application or .app.
